The Kane County Division of Transportation is in need of professional services from a qualified consultant to provide Phase II – Pavement Management Services for roadways within Kane County.

The attached **Project Description** provides a summary of major items that are likely to be encountered during the course of the Phase II services required.

At this time, the County anticipates a completion date, of data collection within this contract, by May 2019.

The 2–page Statement of Interest document shall be submitted electronically via KDOT QBS no later than 2:00 pm on August 14, 2018. If you plan to enter into a joint venture with another firm for this project please note this on your Statement of Interest, including the name of the firm you are entering into a joint venture with for this project. Any new firm interested in doing work with the Kane County in regards to this or any other future professional service, must first submit their Prequalification Document to Kane County by following the instructions found at <u>http://kdot.countyofkane.org/Shared%20Documents/QBS.pdf</u>. The prequalification document will be reviewed and approved in a short period of time if the appropriate documentation was provided. Each firm must first be prequalified in order to electronically submit their Statement of Interest via KDOT QBS no later than the deadline described above.

Phase II - PAVEMENT MANAGEMENT SERVICES SCOPE OF SERVICES

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The CONSULTANT will provide Phase II - Pavement Management Services for the various items, requested by the COUNTY, aimed at the purpose of preparing a pavement preservation program for the existing roadway network of Kane County. This service shall include all of the various items listed, for all of the existing roadways within the County network.

Items listed below identify tasks included for this service:

- Coordination with Kane County staff.
- Survey data collection, rating the pavement condition of each Kane County roadway using IDOT's Condition Rating System (CRS), using a Digital Survey Vehicle (DSV).
- Structural analysis of the county roadway network.
- Profile data collection identifying the roughness, using the International Roughness Index (IRI), of the county roadway network.
- Collect automated and geo-referenced high-resolution digital images of KDOT's highways.
- Analyze data to assign maintenance, repair and rehabilitation priorities to the roadway network.
- Provide a written memo of findings based on the Pavement Management Services (PMS) collection of data.

A Digital Survey Vehicle (DSV) uses GPS, lasers and cameras to provide data for roadway assessment needs. GPS receivers are used to provide accurate locations of where the data collection is taken from. Lasers are used to measure the surface conditions of roadways and access the paving needs. Measurements pertaining to the longitudinal profile and transverse profile are gathered to determine the roughness, rutting and cross slope. Cameras are also used to collect high-resolution images of the roadway and surrounding area.

The selected Consultant will be responsible for providing all roadway data, as listed above, for all existing county roadways. In addition, the data, in the software, and the software itself will need to be provided for the subject work.

It is assumed the consultant will make one major submittal to KDOT. The submittal will consist of the data collected, in the particular software needed to run the roadway data, and the software itself for future iterations.
